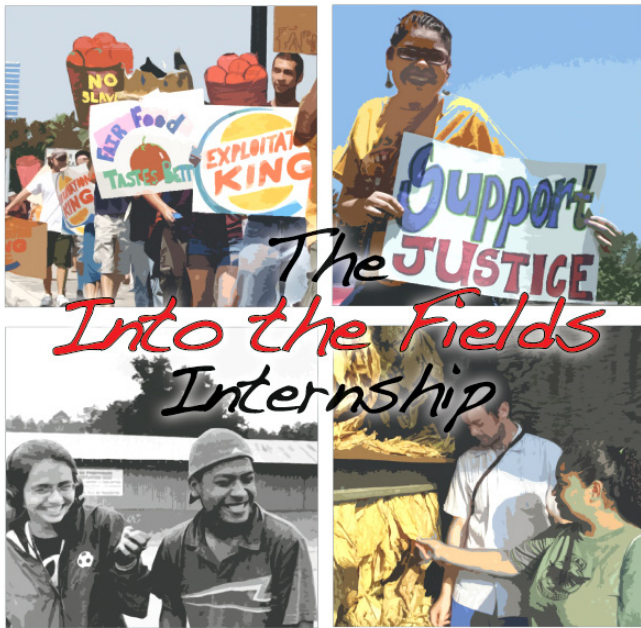


Farmworkers Feed the World!

Yet, they have one of the most *dangerous* jobs and are among the *lowest paid* workers in the U.S. They face discrimination, heat illness, pesticide exposure, poor housing, and low wages. Farmworkers, meat processing workers and allies are *organizing for change*, and students are a big part of that movement. *YOU can make a difference this year!*



Benefits: 10-week summer program

\$1350 total per diem, \$1500 scholarship, free furnished housing, 3 free trainings, and academic credit available. Intern placements are with various types of organizations that serve farmworkers in the Southeast

Eligibility: Must speak intermediate to advanced Spanish



Benefits: 6-month program beginning June 2011

\$9,000 stipend, 3 free trainings, academic credit available. Fellows will set up their own housing and use their stipend to cover living expenses. Fellow placements are with health clinics that serve farmworkers in NC

Eligibility: Must speak intermediate to advanced Spanish, Use of a vehicle for the duration of the program
